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What is the Summer Reading Challenge?

The Summer Reading Challenge, presented by The Reading Agency and delivered by public libraries, is a national scheme that encourages children aged 4 to 11 to set themselves a reading challenge to help prevent the summer reading 'dip'. Children sign up through their local library, choose any library books to read (including e-books, audio books and e-audio books) and get prizes for each of the books they tell us about. 6 books is all it takes to beat the challenge and everyone who completes it will get a medal and certificate. Children can have the certificate presented in school. It is free to sign up, take part and borrow books. This year the theme of the Challenge is Wild World Heroes. It starts 17th July and ends 11th September. You can find out more by visiting www.eastsussex.gov.uk/src

Top tips for families

Chat with your child about what you see on the trail. **Ask open-ended questions so that the answer is not just a yes or a no.** Introduce new words into the conversation. **When you use a new word, explain what it means.** If your child is interested, encourage them to do some research about the word when they get home. **Talk about the day on your way home Ask your child which part of the trail they enjoyed the most and what their favourite new word is.**

What mammals feature on the stained glass window at the front of the Hastings Museum and Art Gallery?


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4. White Rock Theatre
