

## NRCQ 2024: Contacting your local MP

## How and why to engage your local MP

You might want to engage your local Member of Parliament (MP) to raise the profile of the Quiz in your community.







As an MP is elected to the House of Commons by their constituents, they act as a figurehead locally, trying to meet as many people as possible and gather their views to inform their decisions within parliament. They tend to have a large following on social media, weekly newsletters, a website and in some cases a column in their local paper.

For all these reasons, we would suggest writing to your local MP asking them to support and publicise your participation on their channels.

**Top-tip:** If you're a librarian or teacher and your MP supported you through the heats, be sure to tag them on social media if you make it through to the finals! They may want to re-share on their accounts and follow your progress.

**Top-tip:** If you are a regional organiser, you can share this guidance with schools in your areas or reach out to MPs yourself if there are multiple schools taking part in their constituency.

## **Contacting your local MP**

You can check who your local MP is using your postcode <u>here</u> or alternatively, you can call the House of Commons Information Office on 020 7219 4272.

We would advise you to first approach your MP with an email, outlining some background about the quiz and asking very clearly for their support. We have drafted an email template below that you can use. We would also suggest you attaching your press release to this email to give your MP more context. If your school has an existing relationship with your local MP we would suggest that the person who holds that relationship to approach the MP with this request.

It's an initiative from the National Literacy Trust, generously supported by the ALCS, aiming to build a love of reading and celebrate reading for pleasure in schools across the country.

Schools from 22 regions across the UK are competing with others in their area for a place in the national final and the chance to be crowned the National Reading Champions 2024. We are really hopeful that we will make the final and be crowned champions and we would really appreciate your support on our journey to get there.

## MP follow up

Once you have approached your MP and asked them to share a post on social media, we would advise monitoring their account and retweeting/re-sharing their post thanking them for their support.

It's important to build a relationship with your MP so we would advise you to follow up with your MP letting them know how your school got on in the regional heats and thanking them for their support. You can easily update the above email and edit the suggested tweet depending on how you progress through the heats.

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
